

What to do if your child or loved one goes missing.

Especially when a child is missing, it is important to act quickly. Time is an important factor.

- Call the Police immediately. Do not wait or waste time. Remember to stay calm.
- Submit to Police your child or person's fingerprint identification kit.
- Alert friends, neighbors and relatives. Organize a search for the child or missing person as fast as possible.
- Check your child's favorite play area or familiar places. Always check these places, more than once.
- Always be prepared. Protecting a child is a big responsibility.

DNA Sample area

Hair follicles taped to this section for a dna sample if required for identification.

Many children are reported missing across North America, each year.

Identification supplied in the first 24 hours is crucial in their safe recovery.

- Help record and keep finger prints, vital information as well as a photo of each child.
- This is so if the child is ever lost, abducted, or missing, this identification record can quickly be relayed to authorities.
- By having this kit handy, in a time of crisis. It might give you a greater chance of locating your child or missing person.

Finger Print Identification Kit Directions:

Before using the kit, Practice the following simple instructions.

- Enter all applicable information required for identifications, into the spaces provided.
- Clearly print the child or person’s name and date completed on the form.
- It is a good idea for parents and caregivers to update this record annually, due to the changes in characteristics from growth and age, especially for children.

Instructions:

- **Fingerprint your child**
- Finger Prints can be either taken by using ink(*Recomended*), scanned in with a computer.
Regular Stamp Pad ink can be used for precise fingerprint taking. These are available at any office or Dollar store for a very cheap price! Many prints can be taken with just one ink pad.

You may want to practice a few times on a blank piece of paper, before applying directly on the Finger Print Kit. Once satisfied with the practice prints... Then Register the final Prints within the spaces on the kit.

- Prints should have good contact with the paper, especially between the lines.. The thumb, generally produces the best prints.
 - Starting with your child or person’s left little finger, press it gently on the ink, then press down the finger in a flat manner within the space provided.
- Follow the same order, for all ten fingers.
- Allow time for the ink to dry on the finger print chart. if ink is used, use caution not to smear it. Make sure kit is completely dry, before rolling it up, or folding it.
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- Always check the ink label, to make sure it is safe for human contact!
 - Do not get the ink anywhere near your mouth or eyes.
 - When completed, be sure to wash the child or persons hands with soap and water.
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Scanning: Alternative

- In the rare case, you did not want the Child or person to get exposed to ink. Scanning is an option for recording finger prints. Try it both Black & White, for different results, depending on your computer skill.
- Scan child’s whole hand at a high resolution
- Attach the whole print page of scan to this record. Or you could use scissors to separate the specific print parts, and paste them into the corresponding boxes on the finger print chart..
